



Foundation Year

Whether you've now completed all of your assessments, or will be taking some in August, it's important that you recognise your successes particularly in the face of the challenging and unprecedented circumstances you have experienced this year. Even if things haven't gone fully according to plan, you will have skills and strengths to build on.

PREPARING FOR TRANSITION

- 1. Take some time to relax and recharge. It's really important that you make your wellbeing a priority in these difficult times.

- 2. Make a plan for August reassessments (if applicable).
- 3. Reflect back on your studies this year to help you be well prepared for next year.
- 4. When you receive your results, if there's anything you need support with contact Student Services or the Foundation Year Office.
- 5. Make sure you have applied for your Student Finance for next academic year. If you have any issues you can contact Student Services for guidance.
- 6. Research and select your <u>modules</u> for Year 1 study.
- 7. Don't forget that Student Services are available throughout the summer for any wellbeing support you may need.

Reflect back on what your successes have been. These will be the approaches that you should continue into Year 1. For example:

- Have you managed your deadlines well?
- Is academic reading and research a strength?
- Are you a good communicator?

TIPS FOR YEAR 1

- Use your experiences on Foundation Year as a positive starting point for Year 1, as you will have some advantages over students starting directly into Year 1.
- Keep hold of your revision notes as some will come in handy for your course.
- If you can manage the Foundation Year workload, you can manage Year 1!
- Try to get to know new Year 1 students as well as keeping in touch with continuing Foundation Year students on your course.
- Your new academic school will be different to Foundation Year, but course staff are still there to help.
- Use your skills from Academic Development to help with your assignments.
